This Indenture made this the 4<sup>th</sup> day of November 1863 between Marshall Neal and Amelia Ann his wife, of Oldham County State of Kentucky, of the first part and Thomas J. Long of the second part of the County of Oldham and State of Kentucky Witnesseth, that the said party of first part have for and in consideration of the sum of six thousand and fifty Dollars paid as follows two thousand and fifty Dollars in hand, and two thousand Dollars to be paid the 4<sup>th</sup> day March 1864, and two thousand Dollars to be paid 4<sup>th</sup> day of March 1865 for which Lien is retained for the deferred payments. Notes having been executed by the said party of the second part for said amounts have Bargained, and sold and by these presents do grant Bargain, sell, alien and convey, a certain tract or parcel of land it being a part of the same land purchased of M. W. Oglesby & Others, situated and being in the County of Oldham and State aforesaid and lying on the waters of Hloyds Fork bounded as follows. Beginning at a stone near a large pond corner to J. N. Long thence S 61° 16' 16" poles to a stone Vincents line thence near a Wild cherry tree thence with Vincents line S 20° E 139 poles corner to the Old Long tract thence N 70° E 234 1/4 poles to a stone corner to J. N. Long thence N 20° W 96 poles to a stone in Longs line thence S 70° 16' 58" poles to a stake S 89° E 56 poles to a stake thence ~~S 70° 16'~~ N 20° W 45 1/2 poles to the Beginning containing two hundred and sixteen and three quarters Acres, to have and hold the above described tract or premises with all and singular the appurtenances thereunto belonging, in in anywise appertaining, now the said party of the first have granted Bargained, sold and conveyed, and by these presents do grant Bargain and convey unto the said party of the second part their Heirs and assigns forever the said tract or premises, and the said parties of the first for themselves doth covenant and agree with the said party of the second part his heirs and assigns forever, to forever warrant and defend the premises hereby conveyed against the claim or claims of and every person or persons lawfully claiming or to claim the same.
